**Omar:** Hi, I'm Omar. What's your name?

**Dave:** It's nice, Nina. Well, you go through the front door and there's a corridor. Reception's on the left, then there's the Director's office. On the right, opposite reception, there's the teachers' room ...

**Nina:** And where are the classrooms?

**Dave:** There are some stairs at the end of the corridor, on the right. The classrooms are upstairs.

### Present continuous: describing actions or pictures (regular affirmative)

#### Singular

- I'm ( I am) standing.
- He's (he is) standing.
- She's (she is) standing.
- It's (it is) standing.

#### Plural

- You're (you are) standing.
- We're (we are) standing.
- They're (they are) standing.

**Nina:** What are you doing, Fatimah?

**Fatimah:** I'm doing an English project. It's called 'My School'. Look, this is me. I'm taking a photograph outside the school.

**Nina:** And who's this?

**Fatimah:** It's my friend, Fatiha. She's in the sickbay. She's talking to the nurse.

(It smells, looks, tastes)  
A: What are you cooking, Ranya?  
B: I'm cooking Kapsa.  
A: Kapsa? What's that?  
B: It's Saudi. It's made with chicken and rice.  
A: Mmm ... It smells good. I love chicken.
- **Expressing pleasure; Disagreeing; Table talk**  
Penny: Mmm ... this food looks delicious.  
Nina: And it tastes delicious.  
Penny: I love this bread. What's this in Arabic, Reema?  
Reema: It's called fatirah, Penny.  
Nina: Fatirah ... it's delicious.
- **Are they having ...?**  
• **No, they aren't. They're having ....**  
A: Are they having breakfast?  
B: No, they aren't. They're having lunch.

teach ► teaches

match ► matches

have ► has

Questions	Short answers	
Do I work?	Yes, I do	No, I don't
Do you work?	Yes, you do	No, you don't
Does he work?	Yes, he does	No, he doesn't
Does she work?	Yes, She does	No, she doesn't
Does it work?	Yes, it does	No, it doesn't
Do we work?	Yes, we do	No, we don't
Do you work?	Yes, you do	No, you don't
Do they work?	Yes, they do	No, they don't

### (too + adjective):

I don't like it. It's too small.

### Polite requests:

- Excuse me. Can you tell me, how much is this television?
- Excuse me. Can you tell me, where's the park, please?

A: What would you like?

B: I'd like soup and pizza, please.

A: What would you like?

B: Can I have chicken and salad, please?


